## Vulture CULTURE

With enormous difficulty a 'turtle' drags herself along the sand. She gives birth and then leaves her young to grow. Into this hostile desert environment are drawn four very different groups of people. Representing the basic sections of the orchestra, the strings, woodwind, brass and percussion, they tread carelessly and violently over the creatures in their path. Although crushed several times by the selfish and brutal humans, each young 'turtle' nevertheless manages to learn something from the experiences of the 'sister' before her. VULTURE CULTURE asks if it is necessary to become eloquent only in nastiness in order to survive?

#### THE DEVELOPMENT OF VULTURE CULTURE

VULTURE CULTURE was devised and performed by Lumiere & Son for the Henley Music Festival in July 1984. Originally Frank Millward wrote the music for VULTURE CULTURE for two synthesisers and five singers. A grant from the Theatre and Music Boards of the Australia Council has enabled him to reconsider original musical ideas, augment the score and orchestrate the piece specifically for the Queensland Theatre Orchestra, eight singers and synthesisers. A special sound system has been designed to move the sound around the auditorium of The Princess giving spatial perspective. While remaining true to the original concept, this antipodean VULTURE CULTURE is quite a different piece from that performed on the banks of the River Thames in 1984.

#### LUMIERE & SON THEATRE COMPANY

Lumiere & Son was founded in 1973 by writer David Gale and director Hilary Westlake. Since then it has created forty shows and is one of England's leading companies doing exclusively new work. Trevor Smith joined in 1976 and has performed in most productions. Since 1980 Frank Millward has been responsible for developing the musical aspect of the work, having composed scores for many of the shows. Lumiere & Son tour shows and mount large scale outdoor site specific work, the most recent of which was DEADWOOD, on the plight of the world's tropical rain forests. This was performed by over one hundred actors, dancers and musicians at the Royal Botanical Gardens, Kew. Discussions are under-way to remount this spectacular performance at the 1988 Singapore Festival.
